"RESOLVED THAT, the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District has developed an Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund American Rescue Plan (ARP) Federal Grant Spending Plan; and

WHEREAS, the ESSER ARP Federal Grant Spending Plan includes investments in Mental Health and Social Emotional Learning to support student needs; and

WHEREAS, the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District wishes to enter into an agreement with The Good Life Foundation to provide Training and Social Emotional Learning and Engagement Services at Pine Grove Middle School, which will include weekly staff training workshops, organizational development consulting, and continuous on-site support for student engagement through Life Coach and Family Coach positions; now, therefore, be it

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, authorizes the Executive Director of School Business Administration to execute an agreement with The Good Life Foundation in the amount of \$128,000 in order to provide Training and Social Emotional Learning and Engagement Services for the 2022-23 School Year at Pine Grove Middle School to be paid from federal ARP grant funding using budget F2110.400-04-AR22, as recommended by the Superintendent."

D. <u>Capital Improvement Project at High School & Transportation Center - SEQRA</u>

"WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District (the "Board") has considered the effect upon the environment of proposed work in connection with its district wide Capital Improvement Project, including, but not limited to the following:

Replacement at the Central High School of the artificial turf and stadium lighting, as well as High School parking and replacement of the resilient track system and field events; renovations to the pavement in the front parking lot and loop; replacement of damaged conduit under the student parking lot to the Press Box; masonry restoration at the stadium bathrooms, replacement of the interior lighting and addition of an instant water heater, as well as painting of floors; addition of fencing under the existing bleachers; renovation to the baseball field and drainage; replacement of electronic signage at the front of the building; replacement of a cinder walkway with a concrete sidewalk at the High School; replace lift station, including new pumphouse; replacement of a portion of the existing roof system; renovation of the Auto Tech area with a possible expansion; replacement of interior doors throughout the gym areas; installation of security hardware; renovations to the gymnasium, replacement of gymnasium storefront / door system and various exterior doors; upgrades to the High School Data cabling; and, reconstruction of the failing culvert drain at the cross country course. At the Transportation Center, infrastructure upgrades, paving at the "caged" parking area and fence replacement, as well as replacement of the paving at the entrance drive, front parking, side driveways and rear parking, as well as the addition of exterior lighting. In addition to any other renovations and improvements presented as part of the project scope.

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the scope of the project presented by its architects and has further received and considered the advice of its architects with respect to the potential for environmental impacts resulting from the proposed action; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the Proposed Action with respect to the Type II criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c), now therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education as follows:

- 1. The Proposed Action does not exceed thresholds established under 6 NYCRR Part 617 of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, (SEQRA).
- 2. The Board hereby determines the Proposed Action as a Type II action in accordance with the SEQRA regulations.
- 3. No further review of the Proposed Action is required under SEQRA.
- 4. This resolution shall be effective immediately."

E. Capital Improvement Project Notice of Meeting and Vote Proposition

"WHEREAS, the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District, is a local agency pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), ECL Section 8-0101, et seq., and implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the District is considering undertaking a capital improvement project (the "Project") consisting of renovations, reconstruction, alterations and improvements to (i) the Central High School building, athletic stadium, athletic fields, roads and parking areas and (ii) the Transportation Center including, for both, site and infrastructure improvements, furnishings, fixtures and equipment required for such purposes, architectural fees, and all other necessary costs incidental to such work; and

WHEREAS, the District has prepared, examined and reviewed an environmental assessment form ("EAF") relating to the Project and has reviewed the classifications of actions contained in the Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the District determined by resolution adopted October 17, 2022 that the Project constitutes an Type II Action under 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) of the Regulations and is not subject to review under SEQRA."

"NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Board of Education as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. A special meeting of the qualified voters of the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District, Counties of Onondaga and Madison, State of New York, will be held in the Gymnasium Lobby of the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District Central High School located at 6400 Fremont Road, East Syracuse, New York on December 14, 2022 from 12:00 noon to 9:00 p.m.,

prevailing time, for the purpose of voting on the proposition described in the Notice of Special District Meeting hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. The business to be acted upon at said Special District Meeting shall be as stated in the Notice thereof, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause the Notice of said Special District Meeting to be published in the *Syracuse Post Standard*, a newspaper having a general circulation within the District, such publication to be made no fewer than four (4) times in such newspaper within the seven (7) weeks next preceding such Special District Meeting, the first publication to be at least forty-five (45) days prior to the date of said Special District Meeting on or about October 30, 2022.

Shall the Board of Education undertake a project consisting of renovations, reconstruction, alterations and improvements to (i) the Central High School building, athletic stadium, athletic fields, roads and parking areas and (ii) the Transportation Center including, for both, site and infrastructure improvements, furnishings, fixtures and equipment required for such purposes, architectural fees, and all other necessary costs incidental to such work, at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$15,300,000 and obtain the necessary funds by using up to \$500,000 from the District's Capital Reserve Fund, available State building aid and the levy of a tax in the amount of \$14,800,000 upon the taxable property of said District to be collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$14,800,000.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that voting upon the foregoing Proposition will be by paper ballot or voting machine and will take place on December 14, 2022 in the Gymnasium Lobby of the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District Central High School located at 6400 Fremont Road, East Syracuse, New York from 12:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., prevailing time.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that qualified voters of the District may obtain applications for an absentee ballot from the office of the Clerk of the District. Completed applications must be received by the Clerk of the District no later than 4:00 p.m. on December 13, 2022 and must be received no later than 4:00 p.m. on December 7, 2022 if the absentee ballot is to be mailed to the voter. Completed applications received after 4:00 p.m. on December 7, 2022 will require the voter to personally appear at the office of the Clerk of the District to receive an absentee ballot. A listing of all persons to whom an absentee ballot is issued will be available for inspection by any qualified

voter in the office of the Clerk of the District between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. during each of the five (5) business days prior to the election.

Completed applications for military ballots must be received by the District Clerk no later than 4:00pm on November 18, 2022. In a request for a military ballot application or ballot, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application or ballot by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail.

<u>Section 4.</u> The vote upon the proposition to be submitted to the qualified voters shall be by ballot on voting machines and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary ballot labels printed in form corresponding as nearly as may be with the requirements of the Education Law.

Section 5. The Clerk of the District is hereby authorized and directed in the name of and on behalf of the District to do all acts and things necessary, following the advice and counsel of the District's Attorney and the District's Bond Counsel, to comply with all applicable laws, regulations and executive orders relating to the Special Meeting to be held on December 14, 2022, and to do all other acts as may be necessary, or in the opinion of the District's Attorney and the District's Bond Counsel, desirable or proper to effectuate the purposes of the foregoing Resolution and to cause compliance by the District with all applicable laws, regulations and executive orders relating to the notice of, and procedural steps to be taken in connection with such Special Meeting.

G. OCM BOCES Weapons Detection Lease Agreement

"WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the East Syracuse Minoa School District desires to enter into up to a 3 year service contract with the Onondaga-Cortland-Madison Board of Cooperative Educational Services (hereafter referred to as OCM BOCES) in order for the Regional Information Center (RIC) to furnish certain services to the District pursuant to Education Law 1950(4)(jj), those services being but not limited to classroom technology and library automation and other instructional technologies in CoSer 562 and/or CoSer 620."

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the East Syracuse Minoa School District agrees to enter into a contract with the OCM BOCES for the provision of said services to the District in total over the life of this agreement not to exceed the principal amount of \$450,000.00 plus related borrowing fees incurred by the OCM BOCES on behalf of the school district, plus yearly Regional Information Center support during the term of this contract. This amount may be amended with the approval of both parties. Payments will be made as part of a regular annual BOCES contract for services. Further, this contract will be finalized by the Superintendent of the school district and is subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Education for both this multi-year service agreement and the OCM BOCES Installment Purchase contract which will be entered into on behalf of the school district at its request. This contract will be for a maximum period of 3 years commencing on or about 11/01/2022."
